SUMMARY

Issue for Consent Agenda

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions as listed on the attachment?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

Proposed Handling

This question will come before the full board at its July 20, 2015 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are two licensing petitions and 24 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective July 21, 2015.

DENTISTRY

15-08-50 Eldad Simantow-Mazlumi Great Neck, NY

(Universitat Hamburg, Fakultat Medizin, Dental Practitioner, September 2009)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Simantow-Mazlumi enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

(4) Satisfactory scores on Parts I and II of the National Dental Board Examinations.	(4)

(5) Acceptable clinically-based dental residency program of at least one year's duration.	(5)
(6) United States citizen or alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States.	(6) Permanent Resident
(7) Evidence of the required course in the identification and reporting of child abuse and maltreatment.	(7) Certification of Attendance for Training in Identifying and Reporting of Child Abuse and Maltreatment.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's professional education requirements be considered fulfilled.

OPTOMETRY

15-01-56 Kathleen Mitchell Nicholls Manlius, New York

(University of Waterloo, Ontario, Canada, O.D., 1997)

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of New York State practical examination requirement, pursuant to §6506(5) of Education Law and section 59.6 of the Regulations of the Commissioner.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Mitchell Nicholls has not passed a satisfactory practical examination as required for licensure either by the endorsement or examination route. New York State accepts a passing score on Part III of the National Board of Examiners in Optometry (NBEO) examination to satisfy the practical examination requirement. The NBEO practical examination was not required when Dr. Mitchell Nicholls was licensed in Georgia in 1998.

Section 6506(5) grants the Board of Regents the authority to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license provided the Board of Regents shall be satisfied that the requirements of such article have been substantially met. Section 59.6(c) specifies that applicants for licensure by endorsement cannot have unsuccessfully attempted a licensing exam without subsequently passing a comparable exam. Dr. Mitchell Nicholls has not taken or failed NBEO Part III. Additionally, Dr. Mitchell Nicholls has documented over 15 years of licensed practice in Georgia.

Based on Dr. Mitchell Nicholls's demonstration of clinical skills through her years of hands-on licensed practice and her success on other professional examinations, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Optometry recommends that the requirement for a satisfactory practical examination (NBEO Part III) be considered satisfied.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Optometry, recommends that the Part III practical examination be considered satisfied.

NOW ELIGIBLE FOR LICENSURE

MEDICINE

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
